## NOVEMBER REPORT

### COVID Update:

Status quo since our Sept. meeting: 4 reported COVID cases, affecting two classes since the beginning of the school year.

## SCHOOL-RE-ENTRY PLAN - Update

The District's new policy on vaccinations will allow us to slowly remove some COVID restrictions, which will take effect on November 24th.

- Hot Lunch: The program will resume in January, with a slow start of providing a hot lunch once per week. More details to follow. The targeted date is Jan. 19th
- Parent Volunteers and Visitors: starting November 24th, we will allow for parent volunteers and guest speakers to come into classes, provided they show proof of vaccination either via email or to the office. For security reasons, we will still keep doors locked and ask parents to book an appointment before coming to BES.
- Assemblies: We will not be having school assemblies until we are mandated by Alberta Ed to not cross-cohort, whenever possible, indoors.
- Div. 3 students at Lunchtime: Given the number of COVID cases has significantly dropped since September, we are revisiting the possibility of allowing Gr. 7-8 students to go downtown at lunchtime. We will inform families next week. We are still having them rotate through the den, intramurals and the option for them to go outside is always there too.

## Opening of Learning Commons/Library

The learning commons has been open to students since October. Teachers can either send a small group of students to exchange their books as needed or come with their whole class for some inquiry-based projects.

#### Supporting Literacy and Numeracy at BES

"The Alberta Government designated \$45 million province-wide to support literacy and numeracy interventions for Grades 1-3 students across Alberta. The government targeted these grades based on information they collected that indicated that the learning of

younger students was more adversely affected by the pandemic than other age levels. CRPS submitted a grant application to receive this funding and was thrilled to recently receive \$63,700 to support Grade 2 and 3 students. Provincial funding will follow in the

new year for identified Grade 1 students who could benefit from additional support. The CRPS Board and the senior leadership team also recognize the critical importance of early interventions. Therefore, CRPS has made the important decision to allocate

additional funding to augment the government funding for literacy and numeracy interventions, to further support students' academic growth. This additional funding will help to mitigate the impact of learning disruptions caused by the pandemic and will also

address the Board's Four-Year Education Plan outcome that focuses on student literacy and numeracy. We are excited to announce that the equivalent of a half-time teacher has been put into place at BES and will begin to provide these additional student interventions this week!" Teachers will work with students identified as being at risk based on the testing data collected back in September.

## **Remembrance Day Project**

Under the direction of Ms. Sunderland, our Div. 3 students took part in an exciting Remembrance Day Project, in collaboration with the Banff Legion: Students collected mason jar to put candles inside and place them next to the gravestone of fallen soldiers in the Old Banff Cemetery. Students also researched some of the soldier's biography. Our students also painted poppies on rock, which appear around town and at the cemetery.
