Dear Caregivers,

On January 23rd, grades 7 and 8's attended an important presentation by Tara Koenig from the Bow Valley Harmony Project (YWCA) and Right from the Start (RFTS). The lesson is designed to educate our students about the importance of being an upstander. An **upstander**, or an engaged bystander, recognizes actions, attitudes, and beliefs that normalize violence and stands up or speaks up against them. The students also learned about and had discussions around the pyramid of violence, and ways to respond to these issues when they arise.

Some important facts:

- Students explored issues coming up for them and brainstormed ways that they can intervene safely and creatively using our 6 D's of bystander intervention.
- This session was a lead-up to Pink Shirt Day (recognized on February 17th for CRPS students and Staff), giving students the tools and language needed to support those experiencing bullying, and act as everyday upstanders. Some grade 7s will be facilitating our Pink Shirt Day Assembly at BES on February 17th!
- These sessions also educated students on how to handle situations where inappropriate comments, jokes, stereotypes, or teasing (gone too far) have occurred which help to create a culture of violence
